From the Pastor's Desk:

"Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:16

This past month, we gathered together to remember Pastor Paul Haffly and the many ways he faithfully shined the light of Christ. We comfort one another in our grief. We celebrate our sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life. We give thanks for the many ways Pastor Paul shined the light of Christ with his family, in the communities he served and as an ordained Lutheran pastor for 68 years!

Lutherans grieve but not as those without any hope. There is one church season every year when we remember and acknowledge our mortality and need for a Savior. It is called Lent. It happens every spring as the days lengthen, hence the name.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday worship when we receive ashes in the sign of a cross on our forehead. It marks the beginning of a 40-day journey toward the cross with Jesus. The cross is where we find our sure and certain hope of forgiveness and eternal life. At the cross and all that led up to it, we begin to understand the depth of God's unending love for us.

This month is also Valentine's Day. The word Lent is in the middle of the word Valentine. Lent is a time to remember the amazing love that God has for you and all people. It is a time to hear Scripture proclaim boldly the nature of God's heart and the nature of the human heart. Lent is a time to consider the nature of God's heart and the nature of our human hearts.

On Ash Wednesday, we hear a call to fast and to return to the Lord. Many people will fast from candy or swearing or something else. That is fine and can be helpful. It can also help to add something during Lent, like adding five minutes to your day to pause and read Scripture and/or pray. Reading a Psalm or a chapter of a gospel every day can be a beautiful practice to add.

In the Bible, we learn of God's never ending love affair with humanity even though we sin and always fall short. Lent is a season to pause and remember how much God loves us. Jesus stopped at nothing to show us how much God loves each and every person, not because we are good but because God is good.

Hunger Walk Run -- an annual 5K walk and "fun run" started in 1984 -- is an event of the Atlanta Community Food Bank that unites our community to raise awareness and critical funds for local hunger relief. Proceeds from the event benefit the Atlanta Community Food Bank and other local nonprofit organizations that support food pantries, community kitchens, shelters and other programs for neighbors in need of food assistance. These benefiting partners help recruit participants and receive a percentage of the funds raised to support their direct hunger relief programs.

In its 38 years, Hunger Walk Run has raised over \$11.7 million for hunger relief - enough to help provide over 46 million meals!

This year Hunger Walk Run 2023 will again be a hybrid event! Whether you choose to walk or run, in person or virtually, you'll join thousands of participants coming together to support our neighbors in need and celebrate achievements already made in the fight against hunger.


