


Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd February 2024

From the Pastor's Desk:

"Holy, holy, holy, my heart, my heart adores you. My heart is glad to say the words: You are Holy, God." ELW 473

It's February, and that generally turns our minds to hearts and flowers as all the stores begin to set out their Valentine's Day supplies. Whether that is a secular holiday that you celebrate or not you can't escape its presence in our society. This year the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday, falls on February 14th. While this might seem like a strange combination, I see it as an opportunity to enter into the Lenten season remembering the greatest love you will ever experience: the love of Christ. Lent begins our season of reflection as we journey toward the Cross. During this journey we often participate in the tradition of fasting where we deny ourselves something that we normally have every day or as an indulgence. This practice is supposed to increase your spiritual awareness and enhance your prayer time. It's a detachment from wants to create more self-discipline. If this is something that you practice that enhances your prayer life and relationship with God, I encourage you to continue to engage with it. If it is something that you struggle with, I'd like to offer an alternative suggestion. Instead of giving something up, I would encourage you to add something. For 40 days I would like you to add a spiritual practice to your daily lives that helps you to learn more about God's love for you and God's work in your life. This can be as easy as keeping your Bible on your nightstand and every night before you go to sleep read from it. You could choose to read a Gospel all the way through a little each night. You could also choose to work through a devotional book that has readings and questions to ponder each day. You could try a new prayer practice such as a centering prayer or lectio divina. Often what can happen after 40 days is that you continue this new practice because you found a profound connection to God through it. You found more love in God's presence through it. Whether you fast or add something new I encourage you to engage in some kind of new spiritual practice during this Lenten season. It is a sacred time in our church year where our hearts are touched and often changed by God's abundant grace and mercy and by how far God is willing to go in God's love for us, God's beloved.

Our next after service Fellowship Hour will be February 18th.


Church Calendar:

End-of-the-Year Offering Statements and Financial Report:



AC/Parking Lot Fund:

The AC/Parking Lot Fund had reached \$40,691.66, of the \$100K goal, by the end of 2023. So far this year, an additional \$200 has been donated to the fund. The next goal is to cover cost of a new unit for the bathroom/nursery side of the hallway. The other two older units are still working. The current balance in the fund is \$2563.66 after the purchase of the three units that have been installed.

Daily Bread Ministry:



We Currently have 20 residents at the camp. We are full! This month we were able to help three residents obtain their birth certificates and we obtained Georgia ID and/driver's license for three and a Social Security card for one. These documents allow them to apply for jobs, receive services, and drive to work.

We would like to thank you First United Methodist Church for opening the warming center during all those brutal, cold days. Many people, organizations and ministries

provided food for those who stayed at the warning center. It is absolutely amazing how Douglasville comes together to serve those in need.

We had a wonderful surprise this month with a donation of more than 50 coats for the less fortunate in our community. Hadassah Cox, Chisa Ihekwereme, and Sehr Hussain, of the Douglas County High School, International Baccalaureate Program did an amazing job initiating this coat drive. This effort made a difference to those in need!



Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) Listening Session: Monday, February 5, 2024 at 7:00-8:15 pm ET / 6:00-7:15 pm CT, via Zoom.

The Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) was formed by the action of the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly. The assembly action directed the Church Council to develop a CRLC "comprised of leaders of diverse representation from all three expressions that, working in consultation with the Conference of Bishops and the Church Council, shall reconsider the statements of purpose for each of the expressions of this church, the principles of its organizational structure, and all matters pertaining thereunto, being particularly attentive to our shared commitment to dismantle racism, and will present its findings and recommendations to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in preparation for a possible reconstituting convention to be called under the rules for a special meeting of the Churchwide Assembly." As a foundation for its work, the CRLC is hosting various listening sessions, collecting data from a wide range of constituents in order to inform the work of the CRLC. During this listening session, members of the Southeastern Synod will participate in a facilitated group discussion addressing questions prepared by the CRLC and asked at all listening sessions.

This session will be facilitated by Rev. Tiffany Chaney, Pastor Developer of Gathered by Grace in Montgomery and member of the CRLC. This listening session is designed to center the voices of people in the Southeastern Synod. You can register at:
