From the Pastor's Desk:

"When they [the wise men] saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Matthew 2:10-11

We begin the new year in the season of Epiphany. Epiphany comes from the Greek word epiphaneia which means "appearance." To appear is also to be revealed. Appearance brings clarity and we see what we didn't before. This is a season that focuses on the ways that Christ is revealed to us as God's Son, the Messiah. One of the ways we celebrate this is to read about the visit of the Magi to the child Jesus as they recognized that this was no ordinary child. Matthew's Gospel does not specify how many of these "wise men" came to visit Jesus, but it does mention the gifts they brought, and we have then assumed that the number of gifts equaled the number of visitors. While the number of visitors is not important, the gifts they brought are. The meaning and significance of each item speaks to who they see Jesus as and are a foreshadowing of what will come. The gold represents Christ's deity as it meant purity and royalty; the frankincense is a type of incense that would represent priestly worship; and the myrrh represented sacrifice and death and was often used for embalming. These gifts show us that they understood that this child was a king, but also a priest, and would suffer and die for humanity. The child was God's Son, the Messiah and by his appearance among us would change everything. During this Epiphany season look for ways that you see Christ active in your life and in the world around you. How is Christ revealed in your everyday life? How do you reveal the love of Christ to others? Let's go into this New Year together walking in faith to see how Christ is going to live in us and through us in amazing ways. - Pastor Jamie






Adult Education Class:

We have been able to purchase and install three new AC/Heating units: one in the Sanctuary, a unit in the hall way, and one in the Fellowship Hall. We still need to replace one non-working unit for the bathroom/ Nursery side of the hallway. The other two older units are still working. The current balance in the

fund is \$1863.66, so more will be needed to replace the non-working unit on the bathroom side of the hallway and for the parking lot.
