


Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd November 2023

After Worship Adult Education Class:



Beginning on Sunday, November 12th, Pastor Jamie will be leading an adult education class on Sundays, following our worship services. The class will be a study of Luther's Small Catechism using the book, *"By Heart: Conversations with Martin Luther's Small Catechism."*

About the book: "By Heart" is a richly illustrated, in-depth exploration of the Small Catechism. This guide will generate meaningful conversations about the biblical and historical context of the Small Catechism, its link to the church's faith, and its connection to Luther's life and your life today.

The course is built around three kinds of source material essential to a meaningful experience of Luther's Small Catechism:

- Scripture and Tradition. For example, the Ten Commandments as cited in Exodus 20 or the Apostle's Creed as we have it from Christian traditions.
- Luther's explanations of the scripture or doctrine from Christian traditions.
- The "backstory" of Luther's own life and times, the fertile soil of the Reformation itself.

Pastor Jamie has reserved copies of the book from the publisher to get a group discount. Please talk to her about buying the book if interested.

Church Closed During Thanksgiving Week:



Daily Bread Ministry:



Camp Shinnah has been moved to its new location near the Court House. We are still working on organizing the new camp. Currently, we are waiting for Georgia Power to put power in and then we will build a power station which will have a platform and a place to charge phones, make coffee and use a microwave. We have a total of 20 sites and we have one storage area which has a cot in it if needed.

There are 18 residents in the camp at present. Nine

residents have jobs and receive Social Security benefits. We have helped three residents apply for birth certificates this month and three for release of driving records so they can get their Georgia identification cards. In addition, we have helped two residents apply for their military discharge papers, so they can receive their military benefits.

Our needs this month are canned protein and peanut butter. Thank you so much for all of your support and prayers.
