From the Pastor's Desk:

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, 'The one who is righteous will live by faith.'" Romans 1:16-17

This is the section of Scripture that caused Martin Luther to have a revelation about how we are to live by faith and that is what makes us righteous. He went on from there to realize the power of God's grace and the enormous power of the Cross that brings about our salvation. With this revelation came Luther's call to bring about change and reform. His intention was never to break away from the Catholic Church where he served as a monk and professor, but to get the Catholic Church to reform some of their teachings and practices based on the Scriptural evidence he had found that contradicted what they were doing and telling the people. On October 31, 1517 Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany outlining the issues he felt required reform. In this month of October, we remember Luther's actions and how they led to the Protestant Reformation. During the month of October, we will celebrate with a German inspired fellowship meal and two more online classes with in person conversations following about Lutheranism 101. Over the course of the month we will contemplate and continue to learn what it means to live as resurrection people having received grace from God and pray about how we can be instruments of God's grace to one another. On October 29 we will celebrate Reformation Sunday in worship. All are invited to wear red and be ready to sing strongly "A Mighty Fortress." I am excited to celebrate this festive time in the church year as we continue to walk in faith and grow in the knowledge of God's expansive love and grace together.

Participants have the opportunity to listen to guest speakers, visit booths at a convention center, watch live artists, and worship together with 20,000 other Lutherans. Participants also help in local service projects and have the chance to experience the vibrant New Orleans culture.

Cost will be between \$1050 and \$1200 depending on transportation and housing (registration = \$360; lodging with 2/room: \$170/night * 4 nights/2 = \$340; food at \$75/day = \$300).
